

## **CRABC Year in Review**

After our annual meeting in early 2021, we revised our resource guides to be more inclusive of local support groups and doulas. Our community is fortunate to have so many resources listed! When Springtime came, we were asked to share our coalition's past successes with World Breastfeeding Week activities at Minnesota Breastfeeding Coalition's Spring Teleconference. Other coalitions looked to us for ideas and suggestions to start or improve their own events! What a great ripple effect into the rest of Minnesota. During the summer, as years past, we had well-received presence at the fairs in Meeker, McLeod, and Sibley counties with lactation spaces available. Around this same time, Sibley County went door-todoor visiting daycares to hand out goodie bags and encourage Breastfeeding Friendly recognition by MDH. Our annual World Breastfeeding Week Milk Meeting was hosted virtually and by drive-thru, resulting in an attendance of 26 people, 6 latches, and 3 virtual latches. While this event was smaller than in years past, we are happy to have continued the tradition and look forward to growing the event in the future years as we return to "normal."





Throughout the year, our local public health offices and clinics adapted to pandemic hardships and continued to provide lactation support and education to families in our community. Additionally, a coalition subcommittee participated in <u>Coffective</u> coaching and successfully built up the start of an online resource guide. Another subcommittee gathered data and started a "Have You Heard" and "Did You Know" campaign with breastfeeding information. The social media campaign pushed our coalition to start posting regularly on our <u>Facebook</u> page to increase community engagement and provide education. We are excited to continue this campaign and see where it will go next!
