

Cannabis and Home Safety

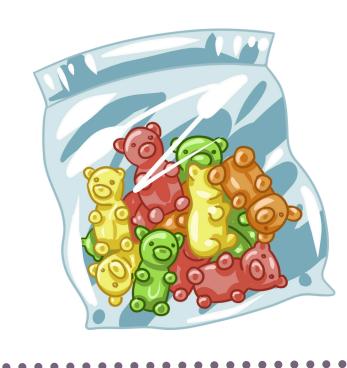
Cannabis products containing THC can now be sold in Minnesota to adults aged 21 and over. Cannabis can be dangerous to anyone under the legal age limit and should not be consumed.

It is important to know how to store these products safely in your home and how to respond in case of an emergency.

Look-Alikes

Some cannabis products can resemble candy, juice or other sweet treats due to their colorful packaging.

This can be dangerous for children looking for a quick snack.

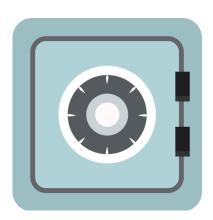


Inventory

Keep a list of the cannabis products you have in your home.

You may need this list in case of an emergency.





Safe Storage

Treat cannabis products like medications. Keep them out of reach and in a locked cabinet, medicine box or safe.

Always keep them in their original, child-resistant packaging.

In Case of Emergency

Call a medical professional or the Minnesota Regional Poison Center at **1-800-222-1222** if you suspect or know your child has consumed cannabis.

Cannabis can take 30 minutes to two hours to take effect, so even if your child seems fine, they still may need medical attention.

The Poison Center can help you determine your next steps to care for your child. They are free, confidential and available 24/7/365.

Safety Tips

Follow package directions and be mindful of serving sizes.

Be aware that cannabis may impair your judgement and ability to care for infants and children.

Do not mix cannabis with alcohol or other drugs, it can cause unwanted effects.

Avoid operating heavy machinery when using cannabis, as it impairs thinking and motor function.
